Research Analysis

HJR1059, as introduced, proposes a constitutional amendment which states that an amendment will become part of the Constitution if it is voted in favor of by a fifty-five percent majority of all of the electors voting on it, except in the case of an amendment that only repeals a provision or provisions of the constitution, which can take effect when approved by a majority of all electors voting. This measure would go up to a public vote and provides a ballot title.
