**Research Analysis**

SB 1151 eliminates redundant language as it relates to valid forms of identification used to determine the recipient's identification number and recipient's agent's identification number in the Anti-Drug Diversion Act. The measure also provides that the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control may disclose nonconfidential statistical information gathered from the central repository to the general public for statistical, research, substance abuse prevention, or educational purposes. The measure clarifies that the information collected in the central repository is to be considered confidential and the records are not subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act, a subpoena or subject to discovery.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure, as engrossed, would modify the ability of the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control to share data collected at their central repository.
