**Research Analysis**

SB 1188 allows municipalities with a population of 4,500 or less to hire any person receiving retirement benefits from a state pension system to fulfill the duties of a police officer. Such persons will not be subject to the requirements of the Oklahoma Police Pension Retirement System, nor will they be eligible to enter into the System.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 1188 in its current form authorizes the employment of certain police officers by certain municipalities and exempts such officer from participation in the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System (OPPRS). Since the officers will not be participating in OPPRS, there is not actuarial impact on the retirement system or the state budget as a result of the provisions of SB 1188.
