**Research Analysis**

Engrossed SB 134 adds the requirement that a schedule of basic child support obligations must be reviewed by the Judiciary Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives every 4 years. In conducting the review, the judiciary committees shall obtain economic data on the costs of raising a child, labor market data, and case data and analysis from the Title IV-D Child Support Program in the Department of Human Services, provide opportunity for public input, and publish information related to the review on the official Senate and House of Representatives websites. Current law only requires the Committees to review child support guidelines.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 134 modifies certain requirements of an existing quadrennial review of child support guidelines required to be performed by House and Senate Judiciary Committees. It is expected that such efforts can be performed utilizing existing legislative resources. For this reason SB 134 is not expected to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or state revenues.
