**Research Analysis**

SB 1456 directs CLEET to promulgate rules to evaluate and approve applications submitted by the Department of Corrections for a separate training academy.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure, as engrossed, would allow the Department of Corrections to conduct its own training academies for correctional officers upon approval and with oversight from the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training.

Upon review and with consultation from DOC and CLEET, passage of the measure will create a fiscal impact to CLEET. DOC has adequate budget resources to implement the provisions of the measure. CLEET officials estimate a need of approximately two full-time equivalent positions to implement the provisions of the measure. These FTE would consist of Field Investigators, whose duties include supervising entities sponsoring their own training academies. The cost for each additional Field Investigator would be approximately \$76,500, which includes salary and benefits. The total impact to CLEET would then be approximately \$153,000 per fiscal year and would require additional appropriations to fund.
