**Research Analysis**

Engrossed SB1569 creates the Address Confidentiality for Child Survivors and their Families Act, which adds human trafficking and child abduction to the list of crimes addressed in the Address Confidentiality Program. The measure defines human trafficking and child abduction.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure, as engrossed, would allow victims of human trafficking and child abduction to apply to the Office of the Attorney General to have their address made confidential.

Upon review, no direct fiscal impact to the state is anticipated from passage of the measure. The Office of the Attorney General currently has a victim address confidentiality program, and the expansion of that program contemplated by the measure would not create a need for additional budgetary resources.
