## **Research Analysis**

SB 1633 prohibits a pharmacy benefits manager (PBM) or an agent of a PBM from imposing certain fees to a pharmacist or pharmacy. The measure also prohibits PBMs from participating in a *clawback* or engaging in *spread pricing* as defined by the measure.

The measure requires a PBM contract to ensure that access to local healthcare is not jeopardized by immediately modifying any rates or provisions that would result in a reimbursement below the pharmacy's cost to acquire and dispense the medication product. PBMs are required to provide the Insurance Department with a report containing certain information. The Insurance Department is required to publish the report on a publicly available website. The measure provides the fiduciary duties of a pharmacy benefits manager to any health carrier and health insurer clients. Lastly, the measure adds new definitions.
