SB 312 provides that a conviction for identity theft committed against a person who is less than 18 years of age results in a felony, punishable by imprisonment of not less than 2 years, nor more than 10 years and a fine of not more than \$100,000.

Fiscal Analysis

The measure provides a separate term of imprisonment penalty for the identity theft of a person less than 18 years of age.

Upon review, the measure may have a fiscal impact. The separate term of imprisonment penalty provided for in the measure is greater than the term of imprisonment penalty for cases of identity theft of adults. Therefore, it is possible that the disposition of certain cases may result in increased incarceration costs borne by the Department of Corrections. The exact amount would ultimately depend on the disposition of cases.
