**Research Analysis**

Engrossed SB492 allows electronic signatures whenever statute requires the signature of a Corporation Commissioner, the Commission chair or vice chair, or the Commission secretary or assistant secretary. An electronic image would also suffice in place of a printed seal when notice by the Corporation Commission is required.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 492 would allow the Corporation Commissioners, their Secretary or Assistant Secretary to use an electronic signature in certain circumstances.
