FA1-A4 to SB 624 designates the bridge over old U.S. Highway 64 on Interstate 4- in Sequoyah County as the Deputy Robert L. Criswell Memorial Bridge.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure directs the Department of Transportation (ODOT) to place permanent markers upon the highways and bridges bearing the name of an individual to be honored. Title 69 O.S. § 1600 provides that the costs associated with signage related to the naming of highways and bridges is to be paid by the group sponsoring or requesting the sign, except in instances of naming a highway or bridge to honor members of the United States Armed Forces, Oklahoma Highway Patrol, peace officers, and first responders who were killed in the performance of their duties.

According to the Department of Transportation, the average estimated cost to the Department is \$880 per location. Such estimate is based on the placement of two signs at each location.
