Engrossed SB63 removes a requirement that a state employee who receives severance benefits as part of a reduction-in-force, and is re-employed by the same agency within one year of separation, must repay part of those benefits.

Fiscal Analysis

SB 63 in its current form, eliminates certain requirements for employees to repay certain severance benefits to an agency employer, when such employee within a certain period is reemployed with the same agency after being subjected to a reduction-in-force. Historical data suggests the instances of application of this provision are not expected to be frequent. For this reason officials for the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) anticipate a minimal impact on the state as a result of the provisions of SB 63 in its current form
