**Research Analysis**

Engrossed SB815 authorizes the governing body of a county or municipality to display the national motto of the United States in a prominent location in any of their buildings. The display of the motto would also include an inscription stating the display is not to be construed to mean that county or municipality favors any religion or denomination.
