**Research Analysis**

The third floor substitute to SB924 authorizes the sharing of state data between state agencies. The measure defines *state data* as all data files hosted, procured, owned, processed, secured, stored or created by the state or state agencies for state business and should include any data not otherwise prohibited from such classification by state or federal law. It establishes that state data is the property of the state unless prohibited by law and that the measure does not exempt or supersede a state agency's statutory responsibility to protect data and to comply with the Oklahoma Open Records Act requirements.

Additionally, the measure authorizes the Chief Information Officer for the State of Oklahoma to establish standards and criteria for the sharing of state data between state agencies. If the requested state data does not meet the established standards and criteria, the request will be denied. State agencies are allowed to decline requests if the requested data is privileged or prohibited from being shared by state or federal law.

Lastly, both the judicial and legislative departments and any entity organized within are exempt from the provisions of the measure.
