**Research Analysis**

SB 980 modifies the Security of Communications Act by adding the offenses of child sexual exploitation or permitting child sexual exploitation and soliciting sexual conduct or communication with a minor by use of technology to the list of crimes allowing the court to authorize wire the interception of wire, oral, or electronic communications by law enforcement.
