**Research Analysis**

House Committee Substitute for SB 999 creates the Oklahoma Courier Application Services Act. The measure establishes a framework for for-hire on-demand transportation of property in a personal vehicle through a digital network. Courier application service companies and drivers are not considered motor carriers of property or for-hire motor carriers. A courier application service company would be required to maintain a zero-tolerance policy against drivers operating under the influence of drugs or alcohol while providing services. The service company must require an individual to submit their address, age, driver license and other information as needed before acting as a driver.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 999 in its current form creates the Oklahoma Courier Application Services Act. The measure places certain requirements on courier application services, but does not task any entities of the state with additional duties. For this reason SB 999 in its current form is not expected to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or state revenues.
