## **Bill Analysis**

HB 1822 establishes rules of conduct for use of the State Capitol Park. The measure provides that handheld signs may not be affixed to a structure or tree, audio devices or musical instruments may be restricted to a level that does not disturb others, digging shall not be authorized, vandalizing historical features and structures is prohibited, contained fires may be authorized in certain circumstances, fireworks are prohibited, obstructing sidewalks or entrances shall be prohibited, possession of explosives or like devices shall be prohibited, throwing projectiles shall be prohibited, erecting tents or overnight accommodations shall be prohibited, there shall be restricted use of motor vehicles in the Park, burial of remains shall be prohibited, waste accumulation is prohibited, and events promoting a for-profit organization excepting those authorized by current law are prohibited.
