Bill Analysis

SB 1107 provides that any offender in the custody of the Department of Corrections who held a valid, unexpired driver license at the time of incarceration shall not be considered to have an expired driver license during the duration of imprisonment for a period of 180 days following their release. Such persons may obtain a REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License prior to discharge from an institution of the Department of Corrections from the Department of Public Safety. The measure authorizes the Department of Corrections to utilize any funds available to cover the costs associated with the implementation and administration of the program. Persons in the program may enter into an agreement with the Department of Public Safety to receive a provisional license provided they agree to pay any outstanding fees and fines associated with the license over an agreed upon period. Monthly payments to the Department of Public Safety shall be no less than \$5.00. Persons 65 years of age or older shall not be required to pay the associated fines and fees.
