**Bill Analysis**

SB 1111 modifies the punishment relating to allowing a “mischievous animal” roam outside of confinement or without restraint. The measure provides that if such an animal harms or kills a human, the owner is deemed responsible and shall be guilty of a felony punishable by not less than 4 years imprisonment. A mischievous animal is defined by the measure as any animal that inflicts great bodily injury on or kills a human being unprovoked.
