**Bill Analysis**

SB 1696 clarifies that all annual hunting licenses shall expire 1 year after the date of issuance. Current law provides for such licenses to expire on June 30 or December 31 of the fiscal year it was purchased depending on the license. The measure redesignates each hunting license issued to residents as an annual hunting license. Fees associated with licenses that expired on December 31 are eliminated. The standardized fee for annual licenses, depending on the age of the resident, shall match the fee currently charged for licenses that expire on June 30.
