**Bill Analysis**

SB 1706 requires a battery-charge security fence to meet certain requirements outlined in the measure. Such fences must interface with an alarm system, be located on nonresidential property, have an energizer that is powered by a commercial storage battery that is not more than 12 volts, is surrounded by a non-electric fence, is clearly marked, and meets certain height requirements. The measure also preempts any municipality or county from adopting any ordinance or regulation of battery-charged security fence provided the fence meets the requirements outlined in the measure.
