**Bill Analysis**

SB 1815 prohibits any entity operating under the protection of the Communications Decency Act from engaging in censorship activities consistent with the definition of a publisher or that removes content that is not prohibited by law. The measure provides that violators shall be fined \$10,000.00 per violation. Any business entity that receives tax exemptions or credits shall not be eligible to receive such benefits for any year in which they have engaged in censorship activities. The measure provides that the Attorney General shall enforce the provisions of this measure and directs 50% of monies raised in this manner to the General Revenue Fund, 25% to the aggrieved party, and 25% to the Attorney General's Revolving Fund.
