**Bill Analysis**

SB 371 creates the Law Enforcement Unification Commission. The Commission is tasked with evaluating the feasibility of unifying the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs, the Department of Public Safety and the Oklahoma ABLE Commission into a single law enforcement agency. The Commission is also directed to study the creating the Oklahoma Office of Inspector General within the Oklahoma Office of the Attorney General and to submit its findings to the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and Speaker of the House no later than December 1, 2021. The Commission will be comprised of 10 members. Members will not receive compensation but shall be eligible to receive travel reimbursements. Members are directed to meet at least once a month.
