ATTACHMENT TO REVENUE IMPACT – HB 3634 [Engrossed] Prepared 3/28/2022

Engrossed HB 3634 proposes to amend 63 O.S. §§ 427.2, 427.14 and 427.16, which relate to the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana and Patient Protection Act.

Section 1 amends 63 O.S. § 427.2, modifying the definition of "medical marijuana business (MMB)" to include a medical marijuana wholesaler, and defining "medical marijuana wholesaler" or "wholesaler" as an entity licensed by the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority to acquire, possess, sell, or distribute medical marijuana or medical marijuana products on behalf of another licensed medical marijuana business in the State of Oklahoma. A wholesaler does not include a medical marijuana business that grows, produces and sells its own medical marijuana, medical marijuana concentrate or medical marijuana products.

Section 2 amends 63 O.S. § 427.14 to add a medical marijuana business license category for medical marijuana wholesaler.

Section 3 amends 63 O.S. § 427.16 to allow a medical marijuana transporter license, when not issued in conjunction with a medical marijuana dispensary, medical marijuana commercial grower, medical marijuana processor, medical marijuana research facility, or medical marijuana education facility license, to be known as a "medical marijuana wholesaler license" or "wholesaler license." Transporter and wholesaler licensee requirements are further modified throughout this section.

HB 3634 is not expected to impact collections attributable to retail sales of medical marijuana.
