Fiscal Analysis

SB 1111 changes the charge and punishment for the owner of a mischievous animal that causes death or great bodily injury to another person from second degree manslaughter to a felony punishable by imprisonment for a term of not less than 4 years. The current punishment for second degree manslaughter is a term of imprisonment of 2-4 years, or imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding 1 year, or by a fine not exceeding \$1,000, or both fine and imprisonment. SB 1111 will likely not have a significant fiscal impact to the Department of Corrections and is ultimately contingent upon factors that cannot currently be quantified such as the sentence imposed by the court for each conviction.
