## **Fiscal Analysis**

SB 1794 would require a DEQ study of the feasibility of the establishment of nuclear power facilities in Oklahoma. Such a study is beyond the capacity of the DEQ Radiation Management Program on its own and would likely involve the assistance of either a consulting firm or a research university, or both. Depending on the breadth and depth of the scope of work, DEQ estimates such contracted assistance could cost \$50,000.00 to \$100,000.00. Even with contracted assistance, DEQ estimates the study would also require substantial time and effort by one or two DEQ Radiation Program staff members during the proposed 15-month period of the study.
