**PROPOSAL:** Amendatory

SB 192 proposes to amend 68 O.S. § 2808 defining "oblique imagery", "orthoimagery" and "unmanned aircraft". SB 192 also proposes to amend 68 O.S. §§ 2818 & 2821 authorizing county assessors to assess and value real and personal property by the current practice of physical inspection or inspection by use of available change detection techniques or software that uses oblique imagery1, orthoimagery<sup>2</sup> or high resolution street level imagery. Additionally, SB 192 requires county assessors to obtain written permission, on a form prescribed by the assessor, from the owner of the property before using an unmanned aircraft<sup>3</sup> to inspect that property.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> "Unmanned aircraft" means an aircraft without occupants that is flown by a pilot via a ground control system or autonomously through use of an onboard computer and other additional equipment necessary to operate the aircraft and includes unmanned aircraft commonly called drones.
