Engrossed SB 379 proposes to amend 68 O.S. §2368.12 to reauthorize<sup>1</sup> the income tax refund checkoff program<sup>2</sup> for the benefit of Court Appointed Special Advocates. The proposal allows donations to continue after December 31, 2021.
