Re: Proposed Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 2758

This bill would allow newly hired military police officers and EMTs from a participating employer to participant in the OPERS hazardous benefit formula.

The fiscal impact would be the participant would contribute 8% of compensation for the first 20 years of service and 3.5% for service after 20 years. For an example a new military police officer making \$30,500 would contribute \$2,440 a year.

There would be no increase in the actuarial accrued liability since the participants will have no past service.
