Research Analysis

The floor amendment to HB 1032 revises the definition of “Home food establishment” in the requirement that businesses have gross annual sales of prepared food of less than one-hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000). It replaces one-hundred twenty-five thousand (\$125,000) with seventy-five (\$75,000).

The floor amendment modifies required information that a producer is to provide to the consumer by removing the option of a personal identification number provided by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry.

The floor amendment authorizes the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry to request proof of completion of the food safety training from a producer after receiving a consumer complaint. It also allows the Department to fine a producer in accordance with Oklahoma law.

Fiscal Analysis

According to the Oklahoma Department of Health, HB 1032 in its current form would eliminate license for homemade food products defined as either “Non-time or temperature-controlled for safety” or “Time or temperature-controlled for safety” under certain circumstances along with eliminating licenses for honey and honeycomb products when producers produce less than five hundred gallons annually. According to the Department of Health the loss of new licenses for both would be \$425 per licenses and the loss of renewal licenses for both would be \$335. If the Department of Health lost between 20 and 50 new licenses it would \$8,500 - \$21,500 loss in revenue and if it lost between 200 and 500 renewal licenses it would be \$67,000 - \$167,500 loss in revenue. This means the annually, the Department of Health may lose \$75,000 - \$188,750 in revenue if HB 1032 passes in its current form.

Additionally, under the increase enforcement responsibility at the Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry, it would require about 1/4 to 1/3 of a new position requiring additional funding of \$16,840.00 to \$22,453.17.

Therefore, depending on the full impact of HB 1032, the State’s budget and appropriations could see a sizeable impact.

The changes in the Floor Amendment do not affect the fiscal analysis of the bill.
