**Research Analysis**

**HB3280** limits the amount of public land owned by the State, state agencies, and federal government to no more than 10% of the total land in the state. Additionally, all easements granted to or reserved by the federal government or the State will be for 30 years or less. Any easements owned by the State or any state agency for more than 30 years will be released and relinquished.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3280 in its current form places certain limitations on land and easements owned or reserved as public lands. If the measure forces a sale of state assets or lands, sale proceeds would represent revenue for the state.

The impact of Section 2's provision requiring the release of certain easements by the state is unknown at this time. If such provision is applicable to the Department of Transportation (ODOT), the provision could result in negative fiscal implications for ODOT.
