23	B. Any person who willfully makes a false statement, knowing							
24	such statement is false, in any application to the Council on Law							

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Enforcement Education and Training for a license pursuant to the Oklahoma Security Guard and Private Investigator Act, or who otherwise commits a fraud in connection with such application, shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony punishable by a term of imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not less than two (2) years nor more than five (5) years, or by a fine of not more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00), or by both such imprisonment and fine.

C. Any person who:

- 1. Impersonates a licensed security guard or licensed armed security guard with the intent to induce another to submit to the pretended authority of the person or to rely on the person's pretended acts of a licensed security guard or licensed armed security guard; or
- 2. Knowingly purports to exercise any function that requires licensure as a security guard or armed security guard, shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than one (1) year, or by a fine of not more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00), or by both such imprisonment and fine.
