The bridge over Elk Creek on State Highway 9 located approximately one (1) mile west of Hobart in Kiowa County shall be designated as the "WWII Doolittle Raider - Bombardier Sgt. Robert James "R.J." Stephens Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

Cantrell, PFC U.S. Army Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.
