7 An Act relating to organ donation; amending 63 O.S.
8 2021, Section 2211, which relates to driver license
9 organ donation procedures; modifying procedures to
become an organ donor; and providing an effective
date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 2211, is
14 amended to read as follows:

15 Section 2211. A. In order to provide an expeditious procedure
16 for a person to make a gift of all or part of the body of the person
17 pursuant to the provisions of the Uniform Anatomical Gift Act, the
18 Department of Public Safety shall make space available on the front
19 and back of the driver license and the identification card for an
20 organ and tissue donor notation. The donor notation shall identify
21 the licensee or cardholder as an organ and tissue donor for the
22 purposes of the Uniform Anatomical Gift Act. Any person may have
23 the organ and tissue donor notation removed from the records of the
24 person maintained by the Department by notifying the Department in

1 writing or by presenting the license or identification card to the
2 Department or a motor license agent for replacement and payment of
3 the appropriate fee, pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-114 or
4 subsection H of Section 6-105 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
5 and informing the Department or motor license agent that the person
6 desires to have the organ and tissue donor notation removed from the
7 license or identification card.

8 B. The process for indicating an individual's organ donation
9 status shall be as follows:

10 1. If the applicant is under eighteen (18) years of age they
11 shall:

12 a. have the opportunity to indicate on their driver
13 license or special personal identification card that
14 the person is willing to make an anatomical gift, in
15 the event of death,

16 b. have the opportunity for the person to consent to the
17 inclusion in the statewide Internet-based registry of
18 organ, tissue, and eye donors and release to
19 procurement organizations, and

20 c. be asked the following: "Would you like to register as
21 an organ donor?"

22 (1) when the applicant answers this question in the
23 affirmative, the applicant shall provide their
24 name, date of birth, driver license number, most

1 recent address, and other information needed for
2 identification purposes at the time of donation
3 to the nonprofit organization contracted to
4 maintain the statewide donor registry; or

5 2. If the applicant is eighteen (18) years of age or older the
6 applicant shall:

- 7 a. have the opportunity to refuse to indicate on the
8 person's driver license or special personal
9 identification card that the person is willing to make
10 an anatomical gift in the event of death,
- 11 b. have the opportunity to refuse to consent to the
12 inclusion in the statewide Internet-based registry of
13 organ, tissue, and eye donors and release to
14 procurement organizations,
- 15 c. be asked the following: "Would you like to refuse to
16 join the organ donor registry?" and state "If you
17 answer 'no' to the previous question, you consent to
18 join the organ donor registry by performing either of
19 those actions.", and
- 20 d. when the applicant does not affirmatively refuse to be
21 included in the registry, provide their name, date of
22 birth, driver license number, most recent address, and
23 other information needed for identification purposes

1 at the time of donation to the nonprofit organization
2 contracted to maintain the statewide donor registry.

3 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
