10	Information Center; requiring law enforcement to provide notice of location of juvenile to Oklahoma
11	State Bureau of Investigation within seventy-two hours; requiring notice to the Center for Health
12	Statistics of the State Department of Health; and providing an effective date.

15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 150.12A, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 150.12A A. It shall be the duty of any sheriff, chief
19	of police, city marshal, constable, or any other law enforcement
20	officer, immediately upon receipt of any report of a missing or
21	runaway person, to send one copy of such report to the Oklahoma
22	State Bureau of Investigation and enter such information, when
23	applicable, to <u>into</u> the National Crime Information Center <u>(NCIC)</u>
24	system in accordance with NCIC standard operating procedures.

1 Whenever a missing or runaway person report regarding a person 2 residing in the State of Oklahoma and under eighteen (18) years of 3 age is received by a sheriff, chief of police, city marshal, 4 constable, or any other law enforcement officer, the reporting 5 agency shall collect detailed biographical and contact information for all involved parties, including the reporting party, any persons 6 7 of interest, and the alleged missing or involved child and shall enter such information, when applicable, into the NCIC system in 8 9 accordance with NCIC standard operating procedures. Within seventy-10 two (72) hours of location or discovery of the missing or runaway 11 person, the sheriff, chief of police, city marshal, constable, or 12 any other law enforcement officer shall notify the Oklahoma State 13 Bureau of Investigation and remove the entry from the National Crime 14 Information Center. Upon location or discovery of the missing or 15 runaway person, the sheriff, chief of police, city marshal, 16 constable or any other law enforcement officer shall immediately 17 make the appropriate entry to into the National Crime Information 18 Center NCIC system in accordance with NCIC standard operating 19 procedures.

B. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and the Oklahoma
Law Enforcement Telecommunications System shall jointly establish
the procedures and guidelines necessary for enacting and maintaining
an electronic database for missing and runaway persons in the State
of Oklahoma which is compatible with the data collection entry

procedures of the National Crime Information Center. The Oklahoma
 State Bureau of Investigation shall establish guidelines for law
 enforcement officers concerning the collection and dissemination of
 information concerning missing or runaway persons.

5 C. Whenever a missing or runaway person report regarding a person born residing in the State of Oklahoma and under eighteen 6 7 (18) years of age is received by a sheriff, chief of police, city marshal, constable or any other law enforcement officer, and there 8 9 is reason to believe that the person is the victim of a family 10 abduction, the reporting agency shall collect detailed biographical 11 and contact information for all involved parties, including the 12 reporting party, any persons of interest, and the alleged missing or 13 involved child. The reporting agency shall notify the Oklahoma 14 State Bureau of Investigation, the. The Bureau shall immediately 15 notify the Center for Health Statistics of the State Commissioner 16 Department of Health that the person has been reported to be 17 missing. The Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation 18 and the State Commissioner of Health shall jointly establish the 19 procedures and forms necessary for the transmittal of information 20 between the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and the State 21 Department of Health required pursuant to the provisions of Section 22 150.1 et seq. of this title. Within seventy-two (72) hours of the 23 location or discovery of the missing or runaway child, the sheriff, 24 chief of police, city marshal, constable, or any other law

2	of Investigation. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation shall
3	make the appropriate notification to the Center for Health
4	Statistics of the State Department of Health.
5	D. The Bureau shall establish a program to periodically
6	publicize the names and pictures of missing children along with a
7	missing children hot-line <u>hotline</u> number on OETA .
8	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
