HOUSE JOINT  
RESOLUTION 1068

AS INTRODUCED

A Joint Resolution relating to workers' compensation;  
approving certain fee schedule; directing  
distribution; providing an effective date; and  
declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, paragraph 14 of subsection H of Section 50 of Title 85A  
of the Oklahoma Statutes requires the Workers' Compensation  
Commission to evaluate the Fee Schedule for maximum rates paid for  
reimbursement to medical providers and adopt updates or adjustments;  
and

WHEREAS, paragraph 14 of subsection H of Section 50 of Title 85A  
of the Oklahoma Statutes also requires the Workers' Compensation  
Commission to submit the updated and adjusted Fee Schedule to the  
President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of  
Representatives and the Governor; and

1 WHEREAS, paragraph 14 of subsection H of Section 50 of Title 85A  
2 of the Oklahoma Statutes requires approval by the Legislature of the  
3 proposed Fee Schedule before the Fee Schedule can become effective;  
4 and

5 WHEREAS, if approved by the Legislature, the proposed Fee  
6 Schedule becomes effective on July 1 following the legislative  
7 session in which the Fee Schedule received legislative approval.

8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES  
9 AND THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

10 SECTION 1. The proposed Fee Schedule for maximum rates paid for  
11 reimbursement to medical providers, as amended and updated pursuant  
12 to paragraph 14 of subsection H of Section 50 of Title 85A of the  
13 Oklahoma Statutes, and submitted to the President Pro Tempore of the  
14 Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the  
15 Governor, is hereby approved as required by paragraph 14 of  
16 subsection H of Section 50 of Title 85A of the Oklahoma Statutes.

17 SECTION 2. Copies of this joint resolution shall be dispatched  
18 to the members of the Workers' Compensation Commission, the Governor  
19 and the Secretary of State.

20 SECTION 3. This joint resolution shall become effective July 1,  
21 2022.

22 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
23 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
24 declared to exist, by reason whereof this joint resolution shall

1 take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and  
2 approval.

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
