7	An Act relating to teacher pay; creating a task force
8	to study and make recommendations regarding certain types of pay to reward the highest quality teachers;
9	providing expiration date; providing for membership; providing for designation of chair and vice chair;
10	requiring appointments by certain date; requiring organizational meeting by certain date; specifying
11	<pre>quorum; providing for frequency of meetings; allowing members to participate via videoconference;</pre>
12	prohibiting compensation or travel reimbursement for members; providing for staff support; requiring
13	submission of certain report by certain date; providing for codification; providing an effective
14	date; and declaring an emergency.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-126 of Title 70, unless there
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	A. There is hereby created until November 30, 2023, a task
21	force to study and make recommendations for pay for performance,
22	qualitative pay, and/or merit pay that would reward the highest
23	quality teachers in this state and could be used to recruit and
24 2 -	retain high quality teachers.

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B. The task force shall be comprised of nine (9) members to be appointed as follows:

<sup>3</sup> 1. Two members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the <sup>4</sup> Senate, one of whom shall be a teacher employed by a public school <sup>5</sup> district located in a county with a population of less than seventy <sup>6</sup> thousand (70,000) according to the latest Federal Decennial Census <sup>7</sup> and one of whom shall be a teacher employed by a public school <sup>8</sup> district located in a county with a population of more than seventy <sup>9</sup> thousand (70,000) according to the latest Federal Decennial Census;

10 2. Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of 11 Representatives, one of whom shall be a teacher employed by a public 12 school district located in a county with a population of less than 13 seventy thousand (70,000) according to the latest Federal Decennial 14 Census and one of whom shall be a teacher employed by a public 15 school district located in a county with a population of more than 16 seventy thousand (70,000) according to the latest Federal Decennial 17 Census:

18 3. One member appointed by the Governor, who shall be a teacher 19 employed by a public school district in this state;

4. One member appointed by the Superintendent of Public
 Instruction, who shall be a current or former Oklahoma Teacher of
 the Year and who shall serve as chair of the task force;

5. One member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, who shall be a superintendent employed by a public school

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1 district in this state and who shall serve as vice chair of the task
2 force;

<sup>3</sup> 6. One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of <sup>4</sup> Representatives, who shall be a superintendent employed by a public <sup>5</sup> school district in this state; and

7. One member appointed by the Governor, who shall be a
superintendent employed by a public school district in this state.

8 C. Appointments to the task force shall be made within thirty 9 (30) days after the effective date of this act. The task force 10 shall conduct an organizational meeting not later than September 1, 11 2022.

D. A quorum of the task force shall be required to approve any final action of the task force. For purposes of this section, five members shall constitute a quorum.

E. The task force may meet as often as may be required to perform the duties imposed upon it.

F. Task force members may participate via videoconference if
 they are visible and audible to each other through a video monitor.

G. Members of the task force shall receive no compensation or travel reimbursement.

H. The State Department of Education shall provide staff and
 administrative support for the task force.

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1	I. The task force shall submit a report of its findings and
2	recommendations by November 30, 2023, to the chairs of the Senate
3	and House of Representatives education committees.
4	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.
5	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
6	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
7	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
8	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
