A. It shall be a policy of the State Board 17 of Education to encourage each public school to explore outreach 18 opportunities such as agreements with the parents of each child 19 enrolled in school. 20 Such agreement may describe the beneficial relationship 21 between parental interest and pupil achievement and provide an 22 agreement that a child will achieve higher levels of competency if

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parents will guarantee that their child will attend school, behave

satisfactorily while there, and complete homework. As part of the

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agreement, the school may state its intention to provide free remediation if a child fails to attain the necessary standards of competency.

- 2. Such agreement may also emphasize the importance of parent-teacher conferences. The agreement should note the days of the school year reserved for professional meetings and staff development and state that on these days teachers are available to meet with parents. Teachers should also be encouraged to schedule conferences to accommodate working parents. Teachers should strive to hold at least one conference with each student's parents at least once each semester.
- B. The State Board of Education also shall require each local board of education to develop initiatives to promote schools as congenial places for parents to visit.
- 1. As part of the initiatives required by this subsection, each school district board of education shall adopt a policy allowing a parent or legal guardian to observe a class in which the parent or legal guardian's child is enrolled or shadow the parent or legal guardian's child during a school day. The policy shall include:
 - a. a requirement that the parent or legal guardian submit a written request to observe a class or shadow a student to the principal of the school site the student attends,

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- b. a requirement that the school site principal approve or deny the request within a period of two weeks from the date of submission. If a request is denied, a parent or legal guardian may appeal the decision to the school district superintendent. If a school district superintendent denies the request, a parent or legal guardian may appeal the decision to the school district board of education, and
- c. a requirement that the observation or shadowing be conducted with minimal interference to the school's learning environment and with all due consideration to the safety of students and school district employees.
- C. The State Board of Education shall also establish a program for encouraging private employers to give employees who have children in preschool programs, kindergarten, or school programs time off to visit the schools for parent-teacher conferences at least once each semester.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
