SENATE BILL 1809

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to hunting; allowing for landowners to hunt on private land at night without permit; defining term; providing certain exemptions; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4-135.2 of Title 29, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. A landowner shall not be required to hold a permit issued pursuant to Section 4-135 of Title 29 of the Oklahoma Statutes when hunting predators at night on their own private land. As used in this section, a "predator" shall mean wild hogs, bobcats, mountain lions, wolves, and coyotes.

B. Pursuant to this section, landowners shall be exempt from statewide season regulations, bag limits, and methods of taking.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
