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## AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to wireless telecommunications carriers; creating the Kelsey Smith Act; providing short title; defining term; requiring wireless telecommunications carriers to provide certain call location under certain emergency circumstances; requiring submission of certain contact information to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation at specified times; requiring maintenance of certain database; requiring promulgation of certain rules; construing provisions; prohibiting civil or criminal liability for certain actions; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

- A new section of law to be codified SECTION 1. NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 178 of Title 13, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Kelsey Smith Act".
- B. As used in this act, "law enforcement agency" means any department or agency of this state or a political subdivision of this state that employs CLEET-certified personnel and is empowered

Req. No. 706 Page 1 by law to maintain public order, make arrests and enforce the criminal laws of this state or municipal ordinances.

- C. Upon request of a law enforcement agency, a wireless telecommunications carrier shall provide call location information of the telecommunications device of a user to the requesting agency in order to respond to a call for emergency services or in an emergency situation that involves risk of death or serious physical harm.
- D. All wireless telecommunications carriers registered to do business in this state or otherwise submitting to the jurisdiction thereof and all resellers of wireless telecommunications services shall submit emergency contact information to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation to facilitate requests from a law enforcement agency for call location information in accordance with this section. Such contact information shall be submitted annually by July 1st or immediately upon any change in contact information. OSBI shall maintain a database containing emergency contact information required pursuant to this subsection and shall make the information immediately available upon request to any law enforcement agency in this state. OSBI shall promulgate rules to implement the requirements of this section.
- E. Nothing in this section shall prohibit a wireless telecommunications carrier from establishing protocols by which the carrier could voluntarily disclose call location information to a

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    law enforcement agency. A wireless telecommunications carrier, its
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    officers, employees or agents shall have no civil or criminal
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    liability for providing call location information while acting in
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    good faith and in accordance with the provisions of this section.
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        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
