2 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1210.508, is 3 amended to read as follows:

the State Board of Education shall adopt a statewide system of
student assessments in compliance with the Elementary and Secondary

All subject matter standards shall reflect the goals as set forth in Section 11-103.6 of this title and of improving the state average ACT score.

The State Board of Education shall 10 ensure that preliminary results for all statewide assessments are 11 reported to districts no later than June 20 of each year and are 12 presented in a manner that yields detailed, diagnostic information 13 for the purpose of guiding instruction and student remediation.
