NEW LAW 20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 748.3 of Title 21, unless there 21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 22 Α. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 23 fund for the Office of the Attorney General to be designated the 24

1 "Victims of Human Trafficking and Prevention Revolving Fund". The 2 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received from penalties 3 imposed by the courts on convictions of human trafficking violations 4 5 and funds received from any other source, including legislative appropriations. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are 6 7 hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Office of the Attorney General for the purposes provided in subsection B of 8 9 this section. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon 10 warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as 11 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and 12 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

B. The purposes of the fund include, but are not limited to:
