10 AUTHOR: Add the following House Coauthor: Swope  
11 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the title, enacting clause, and entire bill  
12 and insert:  
13 "An act relating to combatting human trafficking; creating the  
14 Victims of Human Trafficking and Prevention Revolving Fund;  
15 establishing revolving fund characteristics; placing the fund under  
16 the control of the Attorney General; limiting usage of funds;  
17 providing budgetary requirements and limitations; providing  
18 purposes; providing for codification; and providing an effective  
19 date.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:  
22  
23 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
24 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 748.3 of Title 21, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:  
A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving  
fund for the Office of the Attorney General to be designated the

1 "Victims of Human Trafficking and Prevention Revolving Fund". The  
2 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year  
3 limitations, and shall consist of all monies received from penalties  
4 imposed by the courts on convictions of human trafficking violations  
5 and funds received from any other source, including legislative  
6 appropriations. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are  
7 hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Office  
8 of the Attorney General for the purposes provided in subsection B of  
9 this section. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon  
10 warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as  
11 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and  
12 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

13 B. The purposes of the fund include, but are not limited to:

14 1. Educating the public about the recruitment, trafficking, and  
15 exploitation of persons through human trafficking;

16 2. Assisting in the prevention of recruitment in schools of  
17 minors for exploitation;

18 3. Establishing a survivors' resource center to make  
19 information available to survivors of human trafficking about  
20 services and resources, including legal services, social services,  
21 safe harbors, safe houses, and language services;

22 4. Assisting in the coordination between law enforcement  
23 agencies and service providers; and

5. Providing information concerning a petition for expungement of a criminal history record resulting from the arrest or filing of charges for an offense committed or reported to have been committed while the person was a victim of human trafficking.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

10 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 748.3 of Title 21, unless there  
12 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

13 A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving  
14 fund for the Office of the Attorney General to be designated the  
15 "Victims of Human Trafficking and Prevention Revolving Fund". The  
16 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year  
17 limitations, and shall consist of all monies received from penalties

18 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
