BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
The Legislature finds that adequate personnel are critical to
ensuring railroad operational safety, security, and, in the event of
a hazardous material incident, support of first responder
activities, as well as in the interest of the safety of the general
public. Therefore, the Legislature declares that this act
regulating minimum railroad employee staffing to reduce risk to
localities constitutes power to protect and promote the health,
safety, security and welfare of the residents of this state by

1 reducing the risk exposure to local communities and protecting 2 environmentally sensitive or pristine land and waterways. 3 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 104 of Title 66, unless there is 5 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 6 A. Railroads, excluding short lines, operating within this 7 state shall maintain a minimum of two crewmembers in the control 8 compartment of the lead locomotive unit of a train. 9 B. Compliance with subsection A of this section shall not be 10 required during switching operations, brake testing, safety 11 inspections or while performing setouts in conjunction with road 12 service. 13 SECTION 3.
