NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3260 of Title 70, unless there 21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 22 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 23 fund for the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to be 24 designated the "University Campus Security Revolving Fund".

fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of monies appropriated by the Legislature for the purpose of supporting the University Campus Security Grant Program created in subsection B of this section. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for the purpose of running the University Campus Security Grant Program described in subsections B through E of this section. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

- B. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall develop and establish a University Campus Security Grant Program.

 The purpose of the program shall be to enhance campus security at Oklahoma institutions of higher education in order to promote a safer and more secure environment for students, faculty, and staff.
- C. Contingent upon the amount of funds available in the University Campus Security Revolving Fund, the University Campus Security Grant Program shall provide financial assistance to eligible universities for the improvement of campus security. Grant funds may be expended by institutions of higher education for the purpose of providing physical security enhancements for campuses,

including, but not limited to, cameras, gates, lighting, locks, doors, windows, security geofencing, and ballistic storm shelters.

- D. Grant dollars shall supplement and not supplant existing campus security funding.
- E. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall determine criteria and establish a process for the submission of grant applications. The applications shall be considered on a statewide competitive basis. The Regents shall promulgate rules for the implementation of the grants issued pursuant to this section.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
 - SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
