## 1 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 2 2nd Session of the 59th Legislature (2024) PROPOSED SUBCOMMITTEE 3 SUBSTITUTE FOR 4 HOUSE BILL NO. 3277 By: Baker 5 6 7 PROPOSED SUBCOMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE An Act relating to schools; creating the Student 8 Digital Safety and Awareness Act; directing boards of 9 education to adopt and implement digital safety policies subject to availability of funds; providing for selection of certain vendor to provide digital 10 monitoring platform; listing components to address in digital safety policy; requiring data privacy and 11 protection measures and transparency in data collection; mandating schools to report annually on 12 the digital safety policy effectiveness; requiring 1.3 publication of report on certain website; directing the State Department of Mental Health and Substance 14 Abuse Services to issue a request for proposal if funds are available; mandating Department oversee 15 vendor and ensure public school compliance; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and 16 declaring an emergency. 17 18 19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 20 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-100.9 of Title 70, unless 22 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 23 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Student Α. 24

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Digital Safety and Awareness Act".

B. Subject to the availability of funds, public school boards of education shall adopt and implement digital safety policies to enhance digital safety measures at school and utilize the vendor selected pursuant to subsection E of this section to provide a digital monitoring platform to ensure compliance. The policies shall address the following key components:

- 1. Filtering and monitoring, which shall include implementation of real-time filtering and monitoring of internet content accessed by students to block harmful and inappropriate material, as well as to identify potential safety threats;
- 2. Cyberbullying detection, which shall utilize digital safety solutions to detect and prevent cyberbullying incidents by monitoring digital communications and online interactions for signs of bullying or harassment;
- 3. Self-harm and suicide prevention, which shall deploy monitoring features that identify online content related to self-harm or suicide, and enable timely intervention and support for atrisk students;
- 4. Threat alerts, which shall identify potentially dangerous activities or discussions online, and help to prevent school violence and harm to students; and
- 5. Monitoring student online behavior, which shall employ digital safety solutions to monitor and report online behavior of students while safeguarding their privacy. The monitoring shall

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focus on identifying potential risks, cyberbullying, self-harm content, and dangerous activities. The monitoring shall be conducted in English and Spanish.

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- C. The digital safety policies adopted and implemented pursuant to subsection B of this section shall:
- 1. Ensure there is strict data privacy and protection measures in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations. Personally identifiable information of students shall be safeguarded;
- 2. Incorporate transparent processes for collecting and using data with informed consent from parents or guardians of students.

  The school shall clearly communicate how data is collected and utilized for digital safety purposes; and
- 3. Provide parents with the option to manage their student's online activity while using school-issued devices at home.
- D. Public school districts shall annually report to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services on the effectiveness of digital safety solutions in enhancing digital safety, including data on incidents prevented, interventions made, and the impact on student well-being. Each school district's annual report shall be published on the Department's website for public access.
- E. Subject to the availability of funds, the Department shall issue a request for proposal to select a vendor which will develop and implement the digital platform to be used by all public schools

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to adhere to the requirements of the Student Digital Safety and
Awareness Act. The Department shall oversee the selected vendor to
ensure it is capable of meeting the requirements of the Student
Digital Safety and Awareness Act, the request for proposal
application, and any Department policies established to implement
the Act, including all data components, digital safety, and privacy
standards. The Department shall ensure all public schools comply
with the Student Digital Safety and Awareness Act, including
reviewing the schools' adopted policies and procedures and ensuring
adherence to digital safety and privacy standards and utilization of
the selected vendor.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
