A. To be eligible to be a candidate for 17 member of the board of education of a school district or technology 18 center school district, a person must have resided in the district 19 or, if the board seat is in an independent district, have resided in 20 that district for at least six (6) months preceding the first day of 21 the filing period, and have been a registered voter registered with 22 the county election board at an address located within the 23 geographical boundaries of the district for six (6) months preceding 24 the first day of the filing period. Beginning May 1, 1990, no

person shall be eligible to be a candidate for or elected to be a member of the board of education of a school district or technology center school district unless the person has been awarded a high school diploma or certificate of high school equivalency. In school districts that are divided into election districts, a candidate must have resided in the district for at least six (6) months preceding the first day of the filing period and have been a registered voter registered with the county election board at an address located within the geographical boundaries of the election district for six (6) months preceding the first day of the filing period. Beginning May 1, 1990, no person shall be eligible to be a candidate for or elected to be a member of the board of education unless the person has been awarded a high school diploma or certificate of high school equivalency.

- B. To be eligible to vote in a school district election or a technology center school district election, a person must be registered with the county election board at an address located within the geographical boundaries of the district. To be eligible to vote in an election district election within a school district, a person must be registered with the county election board at an address located within the geographical boundaries of the election district.
- C. In addition to the requirements in subsection A of this section, if a person resides in a dependent school district that
