A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW 15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 23 of Title 22, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 16 17 A. As used in this section: 18 "Body camera" means a portable electronic recording device 19 that is worn on the person of a peace officer that records audio and 20 video data of the law enforcement-related encounters and activities 21 of the peace officer; 22 2. "Law enforcement agency" means any department or agency of 23 the state, a county, a municipality, or political subdivision

thereof, with the duties to maintain public order, make arrests, and

1 enforce the criminal laws of this state or municipal ordinances,
2 which employs CLEET-certified personnel; and

- 3. "Peace officer" has the same meaning as such term is defined in Section 99 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- B. A law enforcement agency that permits its peace officers to wear body cameras shall establish policies and procedures addressing the proper use, maintenance, and storage of body cameras and the data recorded by body cameras. The policies and procedures shall include:
- General guidelines for the proper use, maintenance, and storage of body cameras;
- 2. General guidelines for the proper storage and retention of audio and video data recorded by body cameras;
- 3. A policy permitting a peace officer using a body camera to review the recorded footage from the body camera, upon his or her own initiative or request, before writing a report or providing a statement regarding any event arising within the scope of his or her official duties. Any such policy shall not apply to the inherent duty of a peace officer to immediately disclose information necessary to secure an active crime scene or to identify suspects or witnesses; and
- 4. Policies for the proper release of audio and video data recorded by body cameras in compliance with the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

C. A law enforcement agency that permits its peace officers to 1 2 wear body cameras shall: 3 1. Ensure that all personnel who wear, use, maintain or store body cameras, or release audio or video data recorded by body 4 5 cameras are trained in the policies and procedures of the law 6 enforcement agency; 2. Retain audio and video data recorded by body cameras in 7 accordance with the requirements of the Oklahoma Open Records Act; 9 and 10 3. Perform periodic reviews of body camera practices to ensure conformity with the policies and procedures of the law enforcement 11 12 agency. 1.3 SECTION 2.
