15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified				
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-131.3 of Title 70, unless				
17	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:				
18	A. Any person who falsely personates a student of a public				
19	school with the intent to trespass on school premises shall be				
20	guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a				
21	fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by				
22	imprisonment in the county jail for not more than ninety (90) days,				
23	or by both such fine and imprisonment.

- B. Any person who trespasses on school premises by falsely personating a student shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- C. As used in this section, "school premises" means the real property on which a public school is located including, but not limited to, school buildings, grounds, athletic fields, gymnasiums, auditoriums, and parking lots owned or leased for use by the school.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
