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9	COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE
10	An Act relating to workers' compensation; amending 85 O.S. 2021, Section 380, which relates to the
11	Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool; establishing transfer of the Pool to the Office of
12	Management and Enterprise Services (OMES); requiring certain funds to remain with CompSource Mutual
13	Insurance Company; providing for purchase of certain insurance for certain volunteer fire departments;
14	allowing OMES to contract with certain entity or hire personnel; construing provision; directing premium
15	payment by certain state entities; increasing contributions to certain premium; establishing
16	reporting and notice requirements; prohibiting certain financial information from use for certain
17	bid determinations; providing for premium increases of certain amount per annum; updating statutory
18	language; updating statutory reference; creating the Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool Revolving
19	Fund; providing fund purpose; establishing source of fund; providing for codification; providing for
20	recodification; providing an effective date; and
21	declaring an emergency.
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23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
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1SECTION 1.AMENDATORY85 O.S. 2021, Section 380, is2amended to read as follows:

Section 380. A. 1. Volunteer Except as provided for in 3 subsections E though I of this section, volunteer fire departments 4 5 organized pursuant to state law may obtain workers' compensation insurance for volunteer firefighters through the Volunteer 6 Firefighter Group Insurance Pool pursuant to requirements 7 established by CompSource Mutual Insurance Company which shall 8 9 administer the Pool. For the premium set by CompSource Mutual Insurance Company, the state shall provide Fifty-five Dollars 10 (\$55.00) per firefighter per year. Except as otherwise provided by 11 subsection D of this section, the total amount paid by the state 12 13 shall not exceed Three Hundred Twenty Thousand Three Hundred Thirtyeight Dollars (\$320,338.00) per year or so much thereof as may be 14 necessary to fund the Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool. 15 2. CompSource Mutual Insurance Company shall collect the 16 premium from state agencies, public trusts, and other 17

18 instrumentalities of the state. Any funds received by CompSource 19 Mutual Insurance Company from any state agency, public trust, or 20 other instrumentality for purposes of workers' compensation 21 insurance pursuant to this section shall be deposited to the credit 22 of the Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool. CompSource 23 Mutual Insurance Company shall collect premiums, pay claims, and 24 provide for excess insurance as needed.

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1 B. CompSource Mutual Insurance Company shall electronically report, annually, to the Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House 2 of Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of the State 3 Senate the number of enrollees in the Volunteer Firefighter Group 4 5 Insurance Pool, and the amount of any anticipated surplus or deficiency of the Pool; and shall also provide to the Governor, the 6 Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the President 7 Pro Tempore of the State Senate sixty (60) days days' advance notice 8 9 of any proposed change in rates for the Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool. 10

C. The amount of claims paid, claim expenses, underwriting losses, loss ratio, or any other financial aspect of the Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool shall not be considered when determining or considering bids for the amount of any premiums, rates, or expenses owed by, or any discounts, rebates, dividends, or other financial benefits owed to any other policyholder of CompSource Mutual Insurance Company.

Except as otherwise provided by law, any increase in the 18 D. state payment rate for volunteer firefighters under the Volunteer 19 Firefighter Group Insurance Pool shall not exceed five percent (5%) 20 per annum. Any proposed change in rates for the Volunteer 21 Firefighter Group Insurance Pool must be approved by the Board of 22 Directors of CompSource Mutual Insurance Company with notice 23 provided pursuant to subsection B of this section. CompSource 24

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1 Mutual Insurance Company shall not increase premiums for the Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool more than once per annum. 2 1. The provisions of subsections A through D of this 3 Ε. 4 section shall apply only to workers' compensation claims for 5 volunteer firefighters incurred prior to the effective date of this 6 act. 7 2. Not later than the effective date of this act, the Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool shall be transferred to the Office 8 9 of Management and Enterprise Services Comprehensive Professional Risk Management Program. Provided, existing reserves from the Pool 10 11 shall remain with CompSource Mutual Insurance Company for the 12 purpose of managing claims incurred prior to the effective date of 13 this act. All claims incurred on and after the effective date of this act shall be administered by the Office of Management and 14 Enterprise Services (OMES). 15 3. OMES may contract with a third-party administrator or hire 16 not more than two full-time personnel for the purposes of 17 administering the Pool. 18 4. Nothing in this section shall be construed to permit OMES to 19 administer workers' compensation to a paid fire department as such 20 term is defined in Section 29-104.1 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma 21 22 Statutes. F. 1. Volunteer fire departments organized pursuant to state 23 law may obtain workers' compensation insurance for volunteer 24

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1 firefighters through the Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool 2 pursuant to requirements established by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services Comprehensive Professional Risk Management 3 4 Program. 5 2. OMES shall collect a premium of One Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$120.00) per firefighter per year from state agencies, public 6 7 trusts, and other instrumentalities of the state. Any funds 8 received by OMES from any state agency, public trust, or other 9 instrumentality for purposes of workers' compensation insurance 10 pursuant to this section shall be deposited to the credit of the Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool. OMES shall collect 11 12 premiums, pay claims, and provide for excess insurance as needed. G. OMES shall electronically report, annually, to the Governor, 13 the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President Pro 14 Tempore of the Senate the number of enrollees in the Volunteer 15 Firefighter Group Insurance Pool, and the amount of any anticipated 16 17 surplus or deficiency of the Pool; and shall also provide to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the 18 President Pro Tempore of the Senate sixty (60) days' advance notice 19 of any proposed change in rates for the Volunteer Firefighter Group 20 Insurance Pool. 21 H. The amount of claims paid, claim expenses, underwriting 22 losses, loss ratio, or any other financial aspect of the Volunteer 23 Firefighter Group Insurance Pool shall not be considered when 24

1 determining or considering bids for the amount of any premiums, 2 rates, or expenses owed by, or any discounts, rebates, dividends, or other financial benefits owed to any other policyholder of OMES. 3 4 I. Except as otherwise provided by law, any increase in the 5 state payment rate for volunteer firefighters under the Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool shall not exceed five percent (5%) 6 per annum. Any proposed change in rates for the Volunteer 7 Firefighter Group Insurance Pool must be approved by the Director of 8 9 the Office of Management and Enterprise Services with notice provided pursuant to subsection G of this section. OMES shall not 10 11 increase premiums for the Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool 12 more than once per annum. J. For purposes of this section, the term "volunteer fire 13

14 departments" includes those volunteer fire departments which have 15 authorized voluntary or uncompensated workers rendering services as 16 firefighters and are created by statute pursuant to Section 592 of 17 Title 18 of the Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 29-201 through 29-204 18 <u>29-206</u> of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and those defined by 19 Section 351 of Title 19 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

20 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 85.71 of Title 74, unless there 22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 23 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund

24 for the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) to be

1 designated the "Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool Revolving The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal 2 Fund". year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by OMES 3 from appropriations provided for the purpose of administering the 4 5 Volunteer Firefighter Group Insurance Pool in the event that no other funds are available. All monies accruing to the credit of the 6 fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by 7 OMES for the purpose provided for in this section. Expenditures 8 9 from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the 10 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for 11 12 approval and payment.

SECTION 3. RECODIFICATION 85 O.S. 2021, Section 380, as amended by Section 1 of this act, shall be recodified as Section 85.70 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, unless there is created a duplication in numbering.

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
