9	An Act relating to ports; amending 82 O.S. 2021, Section 1141, which relates to the McClellan-Kerr
10	Arkansas River Navigation System Infrastructure Revolving Fund; redesignating fund as the Oklahoma
11	Ports Infrastructure Revolving Fund; modifying conditions for access of the fund; defining term;
12	granting certain authority to the Department of Transportation for use of fund; requiring
13	promulgation of rules; updating statutory reference; appropriating certain monies to certain fund; and
14	providing an effective date.
15	
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 82 O.S. 2021, Section 1141, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 1141. A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury
20	a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Department of Transportation to be
21	designated the <u>"McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System</u>
22	<u>"Oklahoma Ports</u> Infrastructure Revolving Fund" (OPIRF). The fund
23	shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations,
24	for the purpose of pooling all monies received by the Oklahoma

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1 Department of Transportation from appropriations, dedicated revenues, federal funds, private contributions or other sources 2 authorized by law dedicated to the McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River 3 Navigation System (MKARNS) or the waterway ports of this state. 4 5 Such monies shall include but not be limited to: 1. Monies received by the Department of Transportation for 6 waterway projects or infrastructure projects at waterway ports; 7 2. Principal and interest and penalty payments on loans made 8 9 directly from appropriated monies in the fund; and 3. Any other sums deposited into the fund from any public or 10 private source. 11 All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby 12 appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma 13 Department of Transportation for qualified projects upon a 14 recommendation by the Waterways Advisory Board of review by the 15 Oklahoma Department of Transportation and upon consultation with all 16 17 Native American tribes with an ownership interest in the Arkansas riverbed for the purpose of repairing or constructing assets which 18 are part of the MKARNS located in the State of Oklahoma which are 19 essential to the safe and efficient operation of such system and may 20 also be used to match federal grants and awards associated with 21 channel improvements of the MKARNS, whether due to natural 22 disasters, emergency conditions, operations and maintenance needs 23 construction projects approval from the Transportation Commission. 24

The monies placed in the OPIRF shall be invested by the6State Treasurer as prescribed by Section 89.2 of Title 62 of the7Oklahoma Statutes. Notwithstanding any other provision of law,8income and earnings on the fund shall accrue to the fund and may be9used for the purposes provided for in this section. Any interest10earned by the State Treasurer from such funds invested shall be11deposited in the OPIRF.12C. As used in this section, a "qualified project" shall:131. Enhance the safe and efficient operation of the commercial14waterway systems of this state; or152. Repair, improve, or construct waterway or industrial park16infrastructure located at or within waterway ports of this state17that are determined to provide a public benefit.18Such projects shall be developed in consultation with the United19States Army Corps of Engineers and all Indian tribes with an20ownership interest in the riverbed of the Arkansas River when21D. The OPIRF may be utilized by port authorities which have22active waterway ports in this state for pooling available federal,24	1	Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the
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1	private, and state monies for capital projects at their ports for
2	purposes authorized by Section 1106 of this title.
3	E. The Department of Transportation shall:
4	1. Grant or make loans from the OPIRF for qualified projects in
5	order to implement the provisions of this section;
6	2. Grant an amount not to exceed twenty percent (20%) of the
7	funds available in the OPIRF during any one (1) year for qualified
8	projects; and
9	3. Loan an amount not to exceed thirty-five percent (35%) of
10	the funds available in the OPIRF during any one (1) year for
11	qualified projects.
12	No less than ten percent (10%) of the funds available in the
13	OPIRF during any one (1) year shall be reserved for emergency
14	repairs to ports or waterway infrastructure as authorized by the
15	Transportation Commission. Such determination of ten percent (10%)
16	shall be made based off of the funds available in the OPIRF at the
17	start of each calendar year.
18	F. The Department of Transportation shall promulgate rules
19	necessary to effectuate the provisions of this section. The
20	Department of Transportation shall also promulgate rules to ensure
21	that any grants or loans made from the OPIRF are made at market-
22	competitive terms.
23	SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of

24 Transportation from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the

1	General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year
2	ending June 30, 2025, the sum of Thirty-five Million Dollars
3	(\$35,000,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to transfer
4	to the Oklahoma Ports Infrastructure Revolving Fund created pursuant
5	to Section 1141 of Title 82 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
6	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective January 1, 2025.
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
